### **Fact Sheet on Alexandra Health System & its Institutions**

#### **Alexandra Health System**

**Alexandra Health System (AHS)** is a regional healthcare system established on 1 April 2008 to take care of the 700,000 residents living in the northern part of Singapore. AHS currently manages the 590-bed Khoo Teck Puat Hospital (KTPH) in Yishun, which opened in June 2010. To better integrate care and serve the community in the north, Alexandra Health is building the new Yishun Community Hospital, which will be operational in end 2015. The new community hospital will add about 425 beds for sub-acute, rehabilitation, dementia and palliative care.

AHS will also manage a new medical centre in the Admiralty Integrated Development in 2017. Admiralty Medical Centre will further strengthen the primary care network in the north and allow patients with chronic conditions to be managed outside an acute hospital setting. AHS will also operate the new Sembawang Regional Primary Care Centre which will adopt a new model of care to manage patients with chronic conditions.

The cluster is also planning and developing the 1,800-bed Woodlands Integrated Healthcare Campus which will progressively open from 2022. The Campus will comprise a general hospital, community hospital and a nursing home.

Alexandra Health's goal is to make a difference to the population in the north by working together with our partners and empowering the community and residents to manage their health for life.

#### **Khoo Teck Puat Hospital**

**Khoo Teck Puat Hospital (KTPH)** is a 590-bed general and acute care hospital which opened in June 2010. KTPH combines medical expertise with high standards of personalised care, set within a healing environment, to provide care that is good enough for our own loved ones. From intuitive wayfinding to logical clustering of services, KTPH's design is focused on providing a hassle-free experience for patients.

#### **Yishun Community Hospital**

**Yishun Community Hospital (YCH)**, opening in 2015, will cater to the sub-acute and rehabilitation needs of patients. The community hospital, with about 425 beds, will provide intermediate care for patients who do not require the intensive care services of an acute care hospital. YCH will serve the community in the north, where patients can benefit from the integration of the two hospitals in terms of physical proximity, information flow and treatment plans.

### **Woodlands Integrated Healthcare Campus**

**Woodlands Integrated Healthcare Campus (WIHC)** will be opening in stages from 2022. It will comprise a large acute care hospital, a community hospital, a nursing home and other associated facilities and services.

The campus will also serve as a hub that fosters health promotion, engages residents, and connects health and social care providers in the northern part of Singapore. This exciting, state-of-the-art development will be an opportunity to bring healthcare delivery into the next decade, and will pave the way for new and innovative models of integrated care delivery in Singapore. We are looking to redefine the meaning of healthcare, drawing from the best and most innovative practices around the world.

### **Admiralty Medical Centre**

**Admiralty Medical Centre (AMC)** is part of an integrated, mixed-use development that will be built next to Admiralty MRT station. The medical centre will be a one-stop diagnostic and treatment centre, providing outpatient specialist, rehabilitation and diagnostic services to residents in the north, when it opens in 2017.

### **Sembawang Regional Primary Care Centre**

Sembawang Regional Primary Care Centre (SRPCC) will be built in Sembawang Community Hub. The centre will be integrated with a sports complex and a hawker centre to provide a one-stop service for residents. The centre will be a test bed for new care models and processes.
